We will provide some basic information on brewing root beers and making soda. We will also compare the homebrewed versions to various store bought brands to see who comes out on top.

WE NEED HELP WITH THE FOLLOWING:

- * Some research into the historical origins of root beer, its ingredients, and the brewing process, as well as experience brewing root beers and sodas. We can put together the presentation, unless we get a volunteer that really wants to spearhead the presentation effort.
- * Some homebrewed root beers and sodas. Brew up a batch and we will sample it at the tasting. It does not necessarily need to a root beer. A nice orange creme, creme soda, lemon drop, hot cinnamon, or basil oregano soda would be great too.:)
- * Some talented taste buds. So, you know how to taste hops and malts, but what about sassafras, wintergreen, and birch? We need a few refined palettes to have fun comparing homebrewed and commercial root beers.

Directions to the Camp Out

I-71 North or South to I-275 East. Take the Hillsboro exit (#59). At the light turn right toward Hillsboro. You will be on Route 50. It's about 37 miles to Hillsboro. Continue on 50 through Hillsboro to the next town called BOSTON. When you see the Boston sign, the next intersection is the street BEECHWOOD. Turn right on Beechwood. Continue on Beechwood to the stop sign. The street is not marked but it is NORTH SHORE DRIVE. Turn left, travel about 1/2 mile and the drive way will be on your left. We will have the driveway marked. The address is 10915 North Shore Dr. Look for the sign!

This year we again ask a favor from all that attend. With the constant increase in attendance, it becomes more difficult for our host to dispose of trash. Please be aware of this and try to take as much trash (especially bottles and cans) with you as you leave this year. Mike and his family are very gracious to hold this event so let's show them how much we appreciate their hospitality.

An annual competition designed to promote participation in homebrew competitions.

Prizes: Third place - \$50 gift certificate

Second place - \$100 gift certificate

First place - \$300 gift certificate and a trophy cup.

Object: to place in as many homebrew competitions as possible as high as possible.

"Competitions" is defined as any AHA sanctioned point distributing competition anywhere.

Participation is limited to local brew clubs within about 100 miles of Cincinnati such as Indianapolis, Dayton, Columbus, Huntington, Lexington and Louisville.

Winners will be determined by the accumulation of points during a year's time beginning on the first of July each year.

Points will be awarded per below:

Normal AHA sanctioned competitions:

3 points for a first in category

2 points for a second in category

1 point for a third in category

3 extra points for Best of Show

First round National Homebrew Competition:

6 points for a first in category

4 points for a second in category

2 points for a third

Second round National Homebrew competition:

9 points for first in category

6 points for second in category

4 points for third in category

12 points for Ninkasi Award

18 points Homebrewer of the Year

Hosted by Fred Bonjour and the Clinton River Association of Fermenting Trendsetters (C.R.A.F.T.) of Macomb Township, MI, this competition covers any beer style that has been imperialized. Entries will be judged to BJCP Category 23 Specialty Beer, so entrants must include information about what they have done. The competition is not about the biggest beer, it is about a bigger beer done right.

Entries MAY specify the base beer style, and MUST state the original gravity (OG), final gravity (FG), and the type of imperialization (ABV, IBU, etc.).

Note: Beer styles that are imperial by nature (Dopplebock, Eisbock, Strong Scotch Ale, Russian Imperial Stout, Imperial IPA, Belgian Dark Strong Ales, and English and American Barleywines) MUST have OG = 1.100 or greater, and ABV = 10% or greater.
